

## How to Sign the Mishto Pledge: A Step-by-Step Guide

This document explains how charities can sign the Mishto Pledge and what happens afterwards.

### Charities – How to Sign the Mishto Pledge

Charities should send the following to [tyanna@romasupportgroup.org.uk](mailto:tyanna@romasupportgroup.org.uk):

- Contact details for the nominated person to contact at your charity.
- Social media handles for the charity.
- A link to a public statement from a charity representative showing commitment to the Mishto Pledge and describing actions completed or planned that support the Mishto Campaign aims. (This can be posted on the charity's website or social media.)
- A completed Mishto Action Plan.

Once all of the requirements are fulfilled, we will contact you to confirm that you have successfully signed the pledge.

### What Happens After a Charity Successfully Signs the Pledge

- The charity will be listed as a *Mishto Charity*.
- A *Mishto Charity Certificate* will be provided, with permission to use it publicly.
- The charity will receive the *Mishto Campaign Logo*, with permission for public use.
- The named contact will be invited to Roma Rights Forum quarterly meetings.

### Mishto Quality Mark

- When the charity can show significant progress towards the Pledge commitments, it will receive the *Mishto Quality Mark logo* for public use.
- This may be awarded immediately if progress is already in place.

### After the First Year

- The named contact will be asked to complete an online monitoring survey.
