

## How to Sign the Mishto Pledge: A Step-by-Step Guide

This document explains how local authorities can sign the Mishto Pledge and what happens afterwards.

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### Local Authorities – How to Sign the Mishto Pledge

Local authorities should send the following to [tyanna@romasupportgroup.org.uk](mailto:tyanna@romasupportgroup.org.uk):

- Contact details for the nominated person to contact at your local authority.
- Social media handles for the local authority.
- A link to a public statement from a local authority representative confirming commitment to the Mishto Pledge and describing completed or planned actions that support the campaign aims. (This can be posted on the local authority's website or social media.)
- A completed Mishto Action Plan.

Once all of the requirements are fulfilled, we will contact you to confirm that you have successfully signed the pledge.

### What Happens After a Local Authority Successfully Signs the Pledge

- The local authority will be listed as a *Mishto Local Authority*.
- A Mishto Local Authority Certificate will be provided, with permission to use it publicly.
- The local authority will receive the Mishto Campaign Logo for public use.
- The named contact will be invited to Roma Rights Forum quarterly meetings.

### Mishto Quality Mark

- When the authority demonstrates significant progress, the Mishto Quality Mark logo will be provided for public use.
- This may be awarded immediately if progress is already in place.

### After the First Year

- The named contact will be asked to complete an online monitoring survey
